TRÓCAIRE NEWS

In Africa, in particular, the dry season has become more prolonged in recent years, and droughts are becoming more frequent as each year the rains fail to arrive.

Some of you might remember that last year, Trocaire told the story of 8-year-old Nasteha, her parents and brothers and sisters who had lost their home and 200 goats when a record drought hit Somalia. Since we last saw them, Nasteha’s family have built a new home in the camp, her mother Ambiyio has set up a business selling vegetables they grow on their new land and Nasteha and her older brothers and sisters have been able to stay in school for the first time. Despite the floods that hit Somalia last year, the family have begun to rebuild their lives again. *It is thanks to parishes like yours that we are able to report back with good news about the families we work with while also speaking out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice.
