- With regard to wakes in private homes, general advice on household mixing is 3 other households (4 in total) applies.

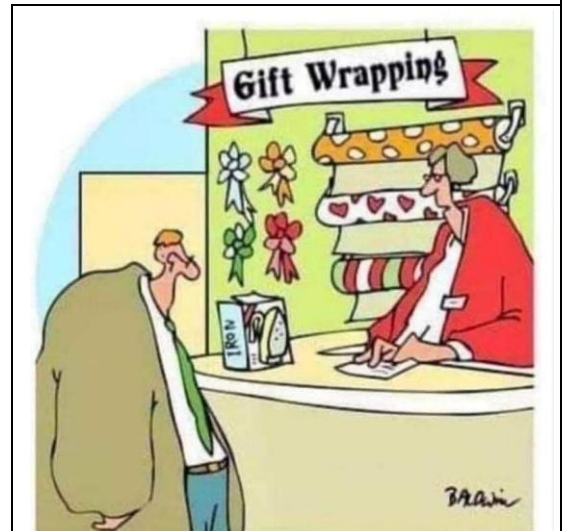
GLENCORRIB NEWS

WHO DOES WHAT AT MASS?

At every Mass you will notice that some members of the assembly have different jobs. We call these jobs 'ministries'. Let's look at some more of them:

At every Mass you will notice that some members of the assembly have different jobs. We call these jobs '**ministries**'. Let's look at some of them:

THE SACRISTAN: This is a very important person in church. They makes sure that it is warm and welcoming, prepare the altar, lights the candles, puts out the necessary books and things needed for the Mass and makes sure that there are enough candles, wine and altar breads for Mass.

THE CLEANERS: In most parishes there are people who look after the cleaning of the church.

ALTAR SOCIETY: They make sure that there are flowers to decorate the altar.

SEASONAL VOLUNTEERS: They may put up the crib at Christmas and decorate the church building for special occasions

PRIEST: At Mass the priest leads us and encourages us to play our part in the celebration.

THE SERVERS: Servers are normally boys and girls who have received their First Communion. Their job is to help the priest during Mass. They can carry books, bring water and wine, wash the priest's hands and ring bells.

MINISTER OF THE WORD: Even though we sometimes call this person the reader, the proper name is 'Minister of the Word'. The readings of Mass come from the Bible. They are the Word of God and so we can say that we hear God speaking to us through the voice of the Minister of the Word.

THE COLLECTORS/USHERS: The people, who welcome people to the church, offer them assistance and collect our gift of money.

THE MINISTER OF THE EUCHARIST: The person who helps to give out communion at Mass. They sometimes bring communion to those who are unable to come to Mass because they are sick.

MUSIC: Many parishes have choirs – groups of people who sing at Mass. Their singing helps the whole assembly to pray, We are all encouraged to join with the choir. Some parishes may have people who lead the assembly in singing. These are called cantors.

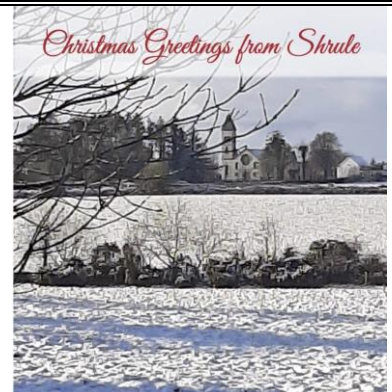

ALMOST 174 YEAR AGO, a headline in the Tuam Herald for January 8th, 1848 reported that:

On Thursday last an inquest was held by Paul Mannon, Esq, coroner, on the body of Patt Maguire, a destitute boy, who died at Shrule, on the evening before. It appeared that the deceased was for some time in the Ballinrobe Union Workhouse, where he was obliged to leave in consequence of the severity of the cold, owing the scarcity of fire in that establishment. He wended his way towards Shrule in search of aid, and on reaching a shed by the roadside, occupied by one of the watchmen employed on the public works in the neighbourhood, got shelter therein and died of exhaustion before morning.

Verdict: Died by starvation and destitution. The Ballinrobe union is under the management of paid guardians.

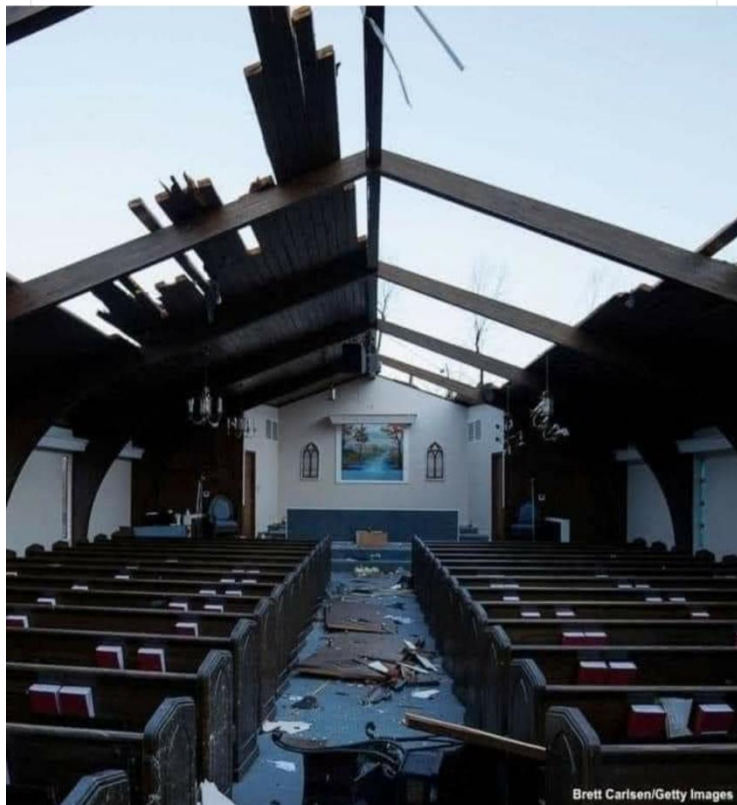
