



Context: Challenges and Hopes for the Synodal Pathway

Bishops are mindful of the challenges and opportunities that provide a context for a synodal pathway leading to a National Synod at this

pivotal time for the Church on our island, which are outlined here: Solidarity, Outreach to the Peripheries and the Promise of a New Pentecost

Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation *The Joy of the Gospel (Evangelii Gaudium*), together with his encyclicals, *Laudato Si'* and *Fratelli Tutti* offer a challenging framework for the Church of today and tomorrow - calling us in particular to solidarity with the poor, the excluded and those "on the peripheries", who yearn for the Good News. This calling also includes initiatives of social friendship in favour of our sisters and brothers in other continents. Speaking at the end of the World Meeting of Families in Phoenix Park, Dublin 2018, Pope Francis encouraged the people of Ireland to be open to the work of the Holy Spirit:

"who constantly breathes new life into our world, into our hearts, into our families, into our homes and parishes. Each new day in the life of our families, and each new generation, brings the promise of a new Pentecost, a domestic Pentecost, a fresh outpouring of the Spirit, the Paraclete, whom Jesus sends as our Advocate, our Consoler and indeed our *Encourager*. How much our world needs this encouragement that is God's gift and promise!"
