



And a cohort of fabulous ladies are straightening the table cloths,


Laying out the sweet cakes,



GLENCORRIB & CROSS ANGLERS ASSOCIATION - NEWSLETTER 2023

I am very pleased to be bringing you the first annual newsletter from Glencorrib & Cross anglers association. The main objectives we had when setting up Glencorrib/Cross anglers last January was to create a club which would contribute to and get involved in stream development and rehabilitation. We also wanted to create a social aspect and bring anglers together, to give people fishing on the eastern side of Lough Corrib a voice and to be in a position to work with like-minded organisations who care about our waterways and everything that lives in or near them. You will see from our newsletter that we have gone a long way to achieving these objectives and in our first year we have excelled when it comes to development projects.

The response to our new club has been enormous and on behalf of the committee I would like to thank you all for your support. We are a small club that is in its infancy and already we have quite a substantial number of members.

I would like to thank Frank Reilly who has worked tirelessly applying for grant aid from various organisations and was instrumental in putting together all our development projects, also a big thank you to Ted Wherry who was the main driving force behind the inaugural E.C.A development competition. There were many others involved in development works, tree planting, club outings, fundraising and the general hard work needed to run a successful club, thank you everyone who helped in any way.

2022 has been a hectic year with lots of great achievements in development, fundraising and protection for our rivers and streams, without your continued support none of this would be possible. The committee and members of our club are sincerely thankful.

STREAM ENHANCEMENTS AND DEVELOPMENT'S

Ballynalty River: The Ballynalty River which flows through Glencorrib and enters Lough Corrib at Ballynalty bay has received a great amount of work over the last number of years. Inland fisheries Ireland was instrumental in planning and overseeing several projects where gravel, random boulders, deflectors, alternative water supplies (solar powered Pumps) and fencing were introduced to protect and develop this very important nursery river.



The Glencorrib & Cross Anglers Association added to all this great development work on the Ballynalty River in 2022 when we purchased 400 native trees. Club members, IFI staff and neighbouring Clubs turned out in great numbers to plant both sides of the riverbank downstream from the main road. This planting gives much needed shelter for fish, provides habitat for insect life and supports birds and animals along the river bank. This work was made possible by the generous funding and help received from LAWPRO (Local Authority Waters Programme).

Cross River: Our club would like to acknowledge the huge amount of work done by Frank Reilly to successfully obtain funding from Inland Fisheries Ireland for a feasibility study on the Cross river. When our application was accepted, we then employed a consultant to conduct the Feasibility study which will be given to IFI in order to develop a much-needed plan for the Cross river and catchment. This study will highlight the problem areas and hopefully with the assistance of IFI we can now create a development plan to enhance the Cross river. The cost of the study was €4980 and we are very grateful to IFI for this funding under the salmon and sea trout conservation fund.

Ballycurrin River

The Club has identified areas on the Ballycurrin River where fencing, stock proofing and tree planting is necessary. As a result, Glencorrib and Cross Anglers have made an application for funding with LAWPRO for €9800. If successful this funding will be spent on a development project in 2023.

The Kilroe River flows into Lough Corrib at Ballindiff bay and is an extremely important spawning river for Lough Corrib. Glencorrib & Cross Anglers in partnership with East Corrib Alliance were involved in a large development project in 2022.


The work completed consisted of approximately 2km of fencing to create a riparian buffer. Two alternative water supplies had to be installed, one of which was a solar powered water pump which now services two water sources. Comprehensive in-stream works included the building of deflectors, creating weirs, digging pools, adding random boulders and placing gravel strategically throughout the river.

The project was a huge success and it was great to be involved with the ECA. The relationship between the four clubs in ECA, (Glencorrib & Cross, Headford and Corrib, Annaghdown and Kilbeg angling clubs) has grown over the first year and the new group is full of positivity towards development and water quality. Glencorrib & Cross Anglers contributed financially to the project and were delighted to be involved with the ECA, the Clydagh Foundation and all the state agencies involved. The overall cost of the Kilroe project would be somewhere in the region of €40,000.



ECA Angling Competition

Last September our club had the opportunity to host the first ECA angling competition. This competition is organised to raise much needed funding for development works on the eastern side of Lough Corrib. We are very grateful to Ted Wherry for the incredible amount of time and work he gave to organising the inaugural competition. The event was a huge success with over ninety anglers from all over the country taking part. Dozens of very generous sponsors gave money and prizes for the day and €5000 was raised for Development works in the future. The atmosphere on the day was wonderful, people were full of enthusiasm and everyone was delighted to support the ECA.



Insurance

The Club secured Insurance cover for all our members from National Anglers Representative Association (NARA). We are delighted with the extensive amount of cover given to all our members through NARA.

Community First Responders (CFRs) are volunteers who are trained to attend certain emergencies in the area where they live or work. Their aim is to reach a potential life threatening emergency in the first vital minutes before the ambulance arrives.

Public Access Defibrillation Scheme

A Public Access Defibrillation Scheme (PADS) is any location that has an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) available for use by members of the public in the event of a cardiac arrest along with a programme of community training.
