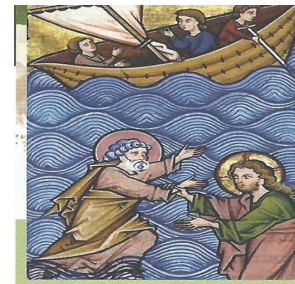


NICENE CREED

Ceremonies are held in the Basilica at 3pm and 8pm each day with anointing of the sick at 2.30, and daily workshops at 12 noon in the Novena Village. The theme for this year's Novena is "Caring for Creation" and the guest speakers are as follows:
