## POPE'S MESSAGE FOR THE FIRST WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

**PART 3 of 3:** The Vatican has released the message of His Holiness Pope Francis for the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which will be celebrated this weekend Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> July on the theme 'I am with you always' (Mt 28:20). The text of his message follows below:

*Dear Grandfathers and Grandmothers, Dear Elderly Friends,*

The prophet Joel once promised: "Your old men shall dream *dreams*, and your young men will have visions" (3:1). The future of the world depends on this covenant between young and old. Who, if not the young, can take the dreams of the elderly and make them come true? Our dreams of justice, of peace, of solidarity can make it possible for our young people to have new visions; in this way, together, we can build the future. Dreams are thus intertwined with *memory*. I think of the painful memory of war, and its importance for helping the young to learn the value of peace. Those among you who experienced the suffering of war must pass on this message. Keeping memory alive is a true mission for every elderly person: keeping memory alive and sharing it with others. Edith Bruck, who survived the horror of the Shoah, has said that "even illuminating a single conscience is worth the effort and pain of keeping alive the memory of what has been." She went on to say: "For me, memory is life." I also think of my own grandparents, and those among you who had to emigrate and know how hard it is to leave everything behind, as so many people continue to do today, in hope of a future. Some of those people may even now be at our side, caring for us. These kinds of memory can help to build a more humane and welcoming world. Without memory, however, we will never be able to build; without a foundation, we can never build a house. Never. And the foundation of life is memory.

Finally, *prayer*. As my predecessor, Pope Benedict, himself a saintly elderly person who continues to pray and work for the Church, once said: "the prayer of the elderly can protect the world, helping it perhaps more effectively than the frenetic activity of many others." He spoke those words in 2012, towards the end of his pontificate. There is something beautiful here. Your prayer is a very precious resource: a deep breath that the Church and the world urgently need. Especially in these difficult times for our human family, as we continue to sail in the same boat across the stormy sea of the pandemic, your intercession for the world and for the Church has great value: it inspires in everyone the serene trust that we will soon come to shore.

Dear grandmother, dear grandfather, dear elderly friends, in concluding this Message to you...I ask the Lord that, also through his example, all of us may open our hearts in sensitivity to the sufferings of the poor and intercede for their needs. May each of us learn to repeat to all, and especially to the young, the words of consolation we have heard spoken to us today: "I am with you always"! Keep moving forward! May the Lord grant you his blessing.

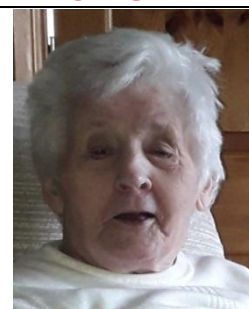

## ORDINATION FOR THE DIOCESE

My name is John Gerard Acton and I am from Knockauranny in Moycullen. I am the youngest of four siblings. Please God, I will be ordained a priest for the diocese by Bishop Brendan at 3.00pm on Sunday next 1<sup>st</sup> August in the Cathedral of Our Lady Assumed into Heaven and St Nicholas, Galway.

Faith is something that was always very important to us at home and my sense of calling to the priesthood was by no means sudden – it was something that gradually increased over many years. I attended both Scoil Bhaile Nua in Moycullen and Coláiste Chroí Mhuire in Spiddal. I went on to study for four very happy years in GMIT and obtained a BA in business and communications.

I spent a number of years working in Debenhams department store before taking up a position in Park House Hotel on Forster Street shortly after graduation. It was during this time that I began to give the possible call to ordained ministry the attention it deserved. I enjoyed my work in the hotel very much, and this made my decision to apply to the diocese all the more difficult. However, I knew that I needed to tease out the notion of priesthood.

I began my initial formation at the national seminary in St Patrick's College, Maynooth, in August 2015. My six years there provided me with the opportunity to take a small step back and to discern what God really wanted me to do with my life.

I am very grateful to my parents Séamus and Maureen, family, friends and colleagues in the diocese and all those who have travelled this journey with me. I have been humbled by the support that I have received these past years in particular and I ask you to please continue to pray for me as I approach my ordination to priesthood and my forthcoming appointment in the diocese.

**THE BUMBLEBEE (BUMBÓG)**

**A few facts about bumblebees.**

- You can identify a bumblebee by its yellow banding and the colour of its tail. Our common bumblebees are white-tailed, red-tailed, buff-tailed, garden and field.
- Wild bees are skilled pollinators. They play a vital role in our fruit and vegetable production. As they visit flowers collecting nectar and pollen this encourages the plant to produce its fruit.
- In Ireland, we have 21 species of wild bumblebee. Six of these are cuckoo bees, just like the cuckoo these bees lay their eggs in the nest of other bees.
- There has been a reduction in the overall number of bumblebees in which 4 species are now endangered and 2 are on the vulnerable list.
- Loss of their traditional habitat, such as wild flower meadows/ borders and increase in pesticides has taken its toll on bee populations.
- A concern for this reduction has seen a significant increase in honey bee hives over the past number of years.
- An increase in pollinators is always welcome. However, the honey bee and the wild bees are both foraging for the same diminishing food source. It is thought that the bumblebee has a food reserve that would last only 2-3 days.



**Remember our wild bees provide a free and essential service to Irish and global farm producers. They are the farmer's friend.**

Small ways in which you can help maintain our wild bumblebee populations -

- Bees have very limited food supplies in the spring, so leave the dandelions for them.
- When cutting back brambles and ivy, leave a little for the bee as the flowers are vital food source. The flowers produce fruit which is food for wild birds.
- Plant lots of bee friendly flowers and flowering herbs in your garden.
- Avoid or cut back on using pesticides.

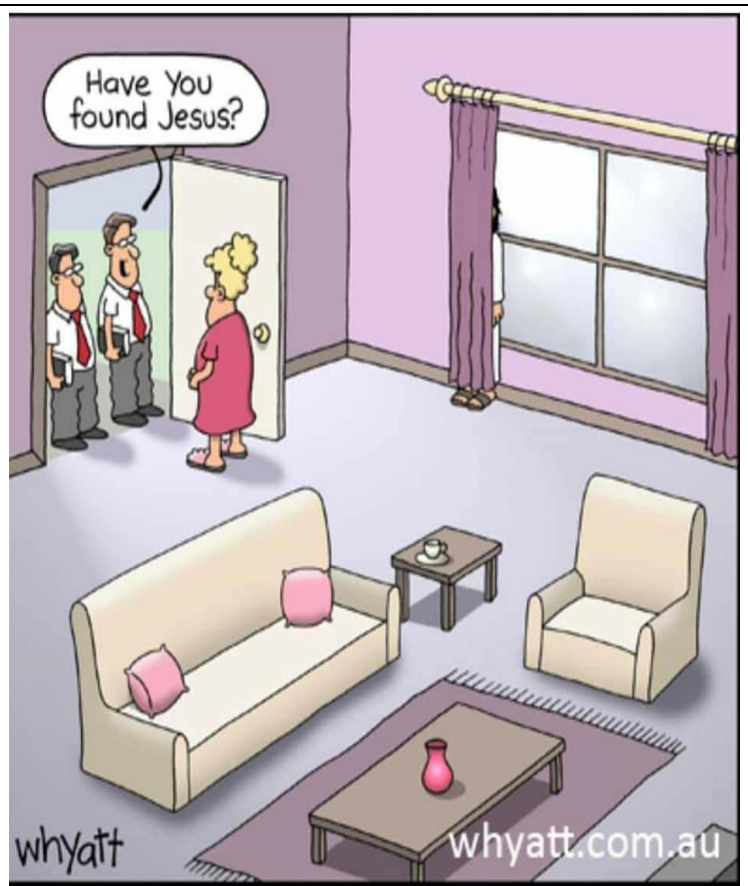

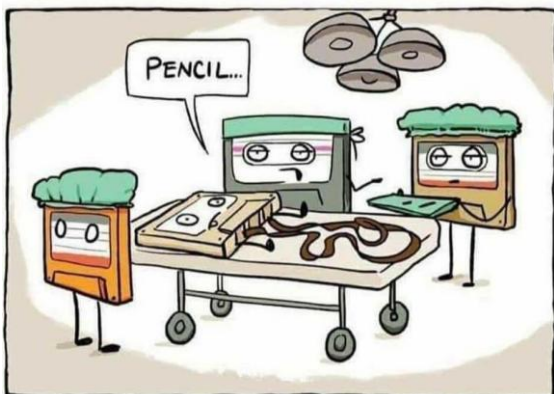

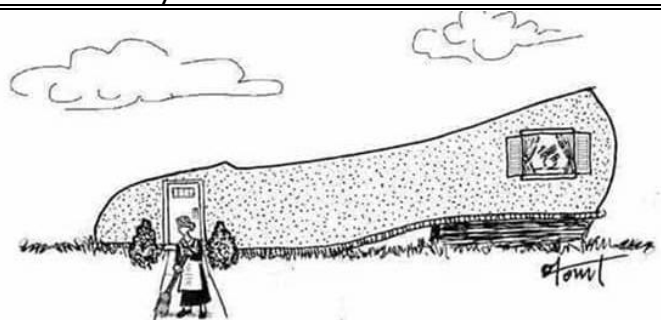
The daughter went to the used motor dealer, returned to her father and said, "They offered me €1,000 because it looks very worn out."
