Let me put it like this: if you are guided
by the Spirit you will be in no danger of
yielding to self-indulgence, since self-
indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit,
the Spirit is totally against such a thing,
and it is precisely because the two are so
opposed that you do not always carry out
your good intentions.
If you are led by the Spirit, no law can
touch you.

looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'

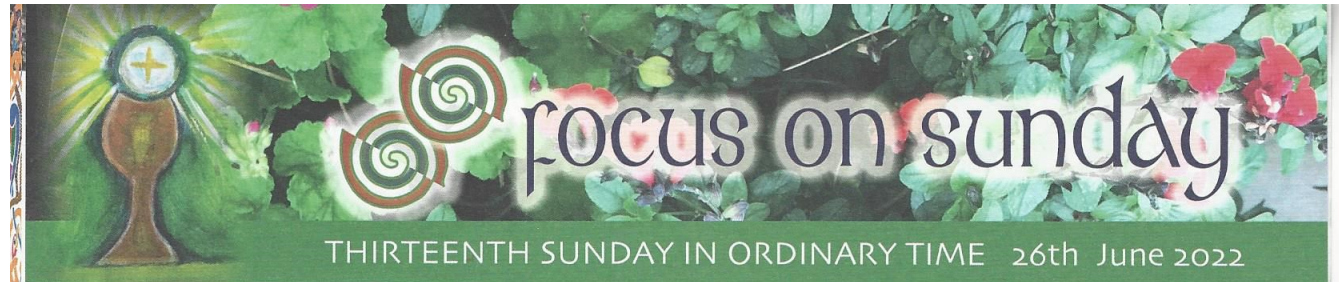

In today's gospel we are told that Jesus "resolutely took the
road to Jerusalem." It took real courage to go and face what
he knew awaited him in Jerusalem. Luke had earlier in the
gospel shown us Jesus struggling with his demons in the
desert. Christianity today is no longer something we absorb
from society around us. It is a personal choice, a resolute decision: do I believe
in God, in Jesus, in the Gospel? Faith doesn't come with a silver spoon. For
some people, faith is the outcome of a moment of truth when they can no longer
live without moral convictions.

On his way to Jerusalem a would-be disciple expresses a desire to follow Jesus.
One wonders about such people in our society today. Some are curious to
know more about Jesus and the gospel he preached, but seem to lack the self-
confidence to talk to someone in the know or respond to the invitation to a parish
information evening. "I'd like to follow you, but...." Jesus makes it clear that
the kingdom of God marches to a drumbeat that's not recognised by this world.
Personal conversion to Jesus opens one's eyes to a different world and doesn't
easily allow one return to what was before. "Once the hand is laid on the plough,
no one who looks back is fit for the kingdom." Sounds harsh, doesn't it. But who
can serve two masters?

In yesterday's church, the church of the fifties and sixties, many were drawn
to serve God as priests and consecrated religious. That vocation has fallen on
hard times today. But Jesus still attracts people, and there are still those who
toy with the prospect of conversion to Christ. We need to give them our time
and patience as well as our understanding of life and the Gospel. The three who
encountered Jesus in the gospel challenge us to listen to where our own lives
are going.

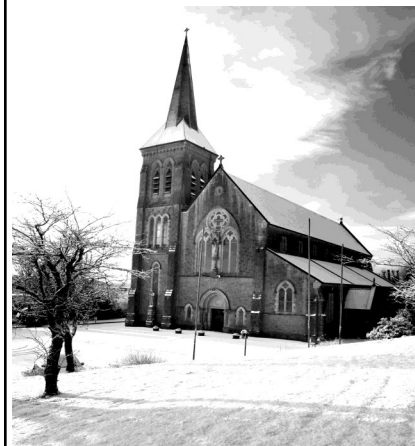

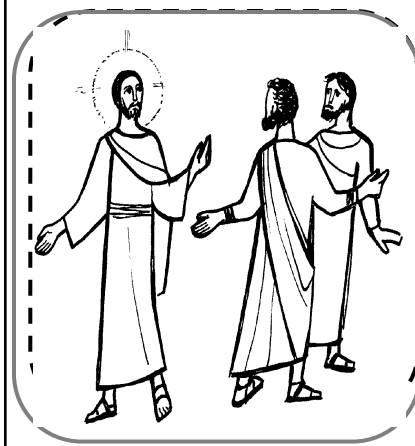
