He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

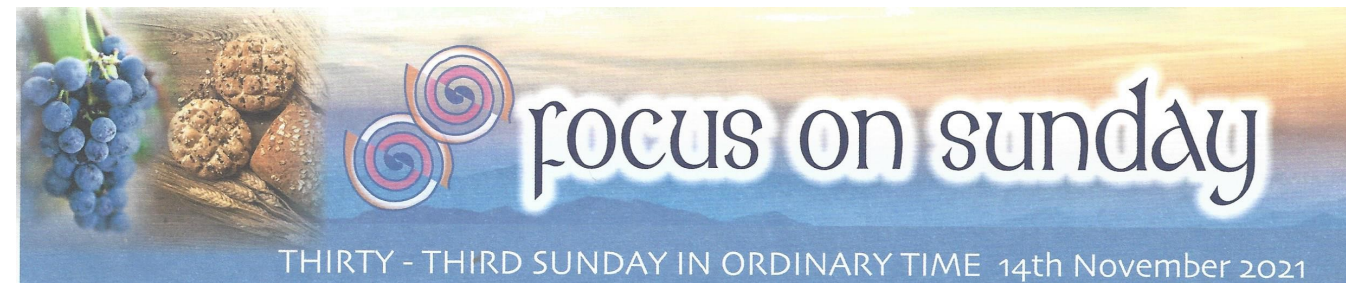

For the World day of the Poor this Sunday Pope Francis writes:

'Very often the poor hear voices scolding them, telling them to be quiet and to put up with their lot. These voices are harsh, often due to fear of the poor, who are considered not only destitute but also a source of insecurity and unrest, an unwelcome distraction from life as usual and needing to be rejected and kept afar. We tend to create a distance between the poor and the rich, without realising that in this way we are distancing ourselves from the Lord Jesus, who does not reject the poor, but calls them to himself and comforts them.'

Psalm 33 says – 'the Lord hears the cry of the poor'. It is through our ears and hearts that the cry is heard. For Pope Francis the poor are: those whose 'hearts are broken by sadness, loneliness and exclusion; those persecuted in the name of a false justice, oppressed by policies unworthy of the name. They are terrified by violence, yet know that God is their Saviour and who, trampled in their dignity, still find the strength to look up to God for light and comfort.'

The gospel reminds us of many for whom the sun is darkened and the moon has no light. May they find in the community of the church the Son of Man coming in the glory of love and generosity for all in need.

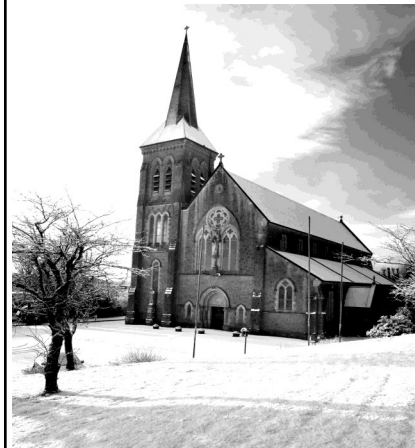

BISHOPS' PILGRIMAGE & MASS IN KNOCK:

To pastorally support everyone who has suffered the pain of bereavement during the pandemic, and in the context of the month of November as the traditional time when we remember our dead, **on this Sunday, 14 November at 3.00pm, the Bishops of Ireland will undertake a pilgrimage to the International Eucharistic and Marian Shrine in Knock.** The bishops will concelebrate Mass for all those who have died in our country during the pandemic, and for their families. At the Mass the bishops will also offer prayers of thanksgiving for all those who so selflessly sacrificed so much during the pandemic. This Mass will be live-streamed on www.knockshrine.ie and broadcast on the RTÉ News Now digital television channel and online.

The bishops invite everyone to join with them in prayer on this solemn occasion.

NEW ARCHBISHOP OF TUAM: On Wednesday last, Archbishop Jude Thadeus Okolo, Papal Nuncio, announced that Pope Francis had chosen Bishop Francis Duffy, Bishop of Ardagh & Clonmacnoise, as Archbishop of Tuam to succeed Archbishop Michael Neary who has reached the age of retirement. We wish him every blessing as he takes up this onerous ministry as chief shepherd of our Archdiocese. We assure him of our prayers and our support as he seeks to lead all the people of God in the Archdiocese of Tuam.

ORDINATION OF PERMANENT DEACONS: Over the past four years, a number of candidates have been preparing for the Permanent Diaconate for the Archdiocese of Tuam under the direction of Fr. Stephen Farragher.

On Sunday 21st November, with God's help, Archbishop Michael Neary will ordain Cathal Galligan, (Corofin), Julian Drapiewski (Athenry), and James McLoughlin (Burriscarra-Carnacon) to the Permanent Diaconate. All three are married men with families and in fulltime employment. While each one was involved in some form of ministry in their own parishes prior to preparation for the Permanent Diaconate, each one is looking forward to taking up this new ministry in the Archdiocese.

The ministry of the deacon revolves around the Word, Altar, and Charity. Archbishop Francis Duffy, once he takes up his responsibilities in Tuam, will, in consultation with the priests and others, assign to the new deacons their particular tasks and responsibilities.
