Reflection

May you all have a very enjoyable Saint Patrick’s Day. This is a very special day for Irish people in Ireland and all over the world. Saint Patrick is one of the patron saints of Ireland, along with Saint Bridget and Saint Columba. Saint Patrick is best known for spreading Christianity throughout Ireland in the fifth century. Most of what we know about Saint Patrick comes from two documents that he himself wrote. One of these documents was his Confession and the other was a letter he wrote to a man called Coroticus. It is believed that Patrick was born in Britain when it was part of the Roman Empire around the year 386CE. When Patrick was about sixteen years old, he was captured and sold into slavery in Ireland. He was forced to work as a shepherd and he lived in Ireland for six years. During this challenging time, he turned to prayer and his faith in God grew strong. One night, Saint Patrick had a dream that a ship was waiting to bring him back to his family. Later he had another dream where he heard the voices of the Irish people calling him to come back and help them learn more about Christianity. Patrick tells us that it was the people of “the wood of Foghill near to the western ocean” that were calling him. Very ancient tradition associates this wood of Foghill with the village of Foghill, which is in the Parish of Lacken in Killala Diocese. Patrick returned to Ireland and travelled all over the country, baptising people and teaching them about God. He used the three leaved shamrock as an image to help explain the complicated concept of there being three persons in one God (God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit). In memory of this, the Irish wear shamrock on Saint Patrick’s Day. Croagh Patrick, the 764

metres high mountain located just outside Westport in County Mayo, is known as Ireland's Holy Mountain. It is particularly associated with Saint Patrick. The name Croagh Patrick, in Irish Cruach Phádraig, means Patrick's Stack. According to tradition, in the year 441 CE Saint Patrick spent the forty days of Lent praying and fasting on the mountain top. It is estimated that about 100,000 pilgrims climb Croagh Patrick every year.
