MARTIN MOLLOY (TOORARD) RIP 1957-2021

Martin was born on the 8th June 1957 being the third child of 7 born to Denny & May Molloy (nee Walsh). Martin was actually the only one of us who was born at home in Toorard in the same room that he was laid out in 64 years later. Perhaps this is where his great love of his home stemmed from.

Martin attended Glencorrib National School and thereafter Ballinrobe for 3 years. His teacher there had impressed on our mother to encourage Martin to stay in school and complete his Leaving Cert as he was very academic. However, Martin had other ideas and got himself an apprenticeship with Lowery's Garage in Headford. In his early twenties, Martin went on a working visa to Australia and so began his great love of travel and later he also worked in Saudi Arabia and Libya.



My first memory of Martin was him looking after myself and my sisters. He was our go to man for fixing our toys and mending stuff for us. Helping our mother with Santa Clause for us and always working on some sort of DIY project in our home. Our house was usually like Heuston Station, there were so many neighbours visiting every day. Martin would be sitting in the middle of them "relaxing" as he would say himself and quietly doing his crossword among all the chaos. Later in his life, Martin was also a Carer himself for our father Denny and gave him great care and attention. Sometimes Denny didn't appreciate all this care and attention from Martin especially when Martin tried to hide his bicycle from him or worse still, try and take it away from him (for his own safety of course).

In 2008 Martin suffered a catastrophic brain injury. Martin now needed a lot of help and was allocated a place in Clarinbridge Nursing Home. This was extremely hard on Martin being so far from home, so Martin and I came up with the plan that if he stopped trying to escape from the Nursing Home that he would only ever spend a few days during the week there while I was gone to work. This was our routine. Through this, the two of us formed an even stronger bond and we shared our life but who could have foretold that a Global Pandemic would hit and in March 2020, Nursing Homes were put into complete lockdown. Martin began to struggle as well as many others in a similar position to Martin from isolation from their families. Skype is a poor substitute for human touch. Martin never contracted Covid, but he was a casualty of its consequences.

Martin was the best brother anyone could have, a true gentleman, who cared, and tried to help everyone and do his best. He made us laugh so much he made us cry, and sometimes he made us cry so much he made us laugh. We will miss his dry wit and big-hearted grin of a smile every day, but we know Martin will never be too far away from the people he loved.

Rest in Peace Martin.

UPDATE ON PARISH PUBLIC LITURGIES & COVID19 PROCEDURES:

October 22nd was the much herald date where restrictions would be eased. However, as figures show, Covid19 continues to remain a danger and to ensure society can continue functioning as normal as possible, certain restrictions remain in place. While the vaccine has allowed society to largely reopen, increasing numbers along with hospitalizations requires all of us to remain vigilant. It is important to be especially conscious of health care workers who now face into a second Covid19 winter. In this regard, as Churches now return to full capacity, please note the following in regard to public liturgies:

- Face masks are to be continued to be worn in both churches.
- Please use hand sanitizer as you enter/leave the church.
- Hand sanitizing at communion time is now optional & available at sanitizing stations. Clergy & EM's are asked to please remain at their designed station to avoid creating confusion and people congregating. It also ensures the one-way system operates correctly. Those receiving are to maintain 1 metre distance from other groupings. If a person is unable to approach clergy or EM, please notify clergy/EM via relative. Clergy/EM will then give Holy Communion to person when they finish at their station.
- As churches have now returned to full capacity, ushers will no longer direct people to seats. It should be noted however, WHO continues to recommend 1 metre distance between pods. Pews in Glencorrib are currently spaced 1 metre. In Shrule, to maintain 1 metre distance would imply using every second pew. Maintaining 1 metre distance is at the distraction of people, and not the responsibility of ushers.
- The 'Sign of Peace' will not be used in liturgies.
- Collection boxes will continue to be used at church doors for weekly, dues and special collections to avoid handling & using baskets across various pods.
- Mass leaflet & newsletter will continue to be distributed by ushers and will be available at church doors after Mass. Please dispose of after use.
- Churches continue to be sanitized on a regular basis, and those attending public liturgies in Shrule are asked to exit via side aisles to avoid congregating in centre aisle.
- Ventilation is considered a key prevention component of Covid19 – for this reason, doors of both churches remain fully open throughout the week and closed only for liturgies. Heating in both churches as a result is curtailed to limited times.

We have moved into a new phase against Covid 19 with a strong emphasis on personal responsibility and mutual respect and awareness of how our actions can/do impact the health/safety of all, including ourselves. We have been extremely fortunate in both Shrule & Glencorrib with the high level of support, help and cooperation from volunteers to the public in keeping our churches safe for everyone over the past 20 months. We can show our appreciation of the effort made by people in doing our part.

Note Regarding Volunteers & Ministries:

When parishes and churches were planning reopening last year, the approach taken for usher volunteers by pastoral council was to divide townlands each church covered into 12 and allot each area a specific month. As restrictions ease, the responsibilities of ushers have also changed.

Changes in Responsibilities Regarding Ushers

In line with above, the responsibilities of ushers have changed to the following:

Ushers:

- Continue to sanitize church as normal. Continue to hand out Mass leaflets & parish newsletter.
- Continue to be responsible for collection box to avoid using collection baskets been passed between different pods/groups.

Ushers are no longer responsible for the following:

- Seating of people – emphasis is now on personal responsibility. Please note pews in Glencorrib are space 1m approx. apart while in Shrule 1m distance requires using every second pew.
- Monitoring of numbers – churches are allowed full capacity.
- Sanitizing before receiving - now optional & personal responsibility.

Pastoral Council Members will no longer be available to substitute or fill in. This is to prevent an unfair overreliance on pastoral council members. Each area is responsible to provide ushers ONLY for the area's respective month.

One of those neighbours notices a stranded driver on the side of the road on his commute to work. He remembers your thoughtfulness and offers assistance to the stranded driver. Several passersby take notice.

At a business office, a woman struggles with a copier. She's had a horrible day. The customer has been waiting, but she remembers the stranded driver she passed earlier in the day. The customer lets the office worker know to take her time. Everyone has a bad day.

We each have the potential to improve each other's lives through understanding and kindness.

Whether it's a friend, family member, co-worker or stranger, our ability to show our humanity should have no limit

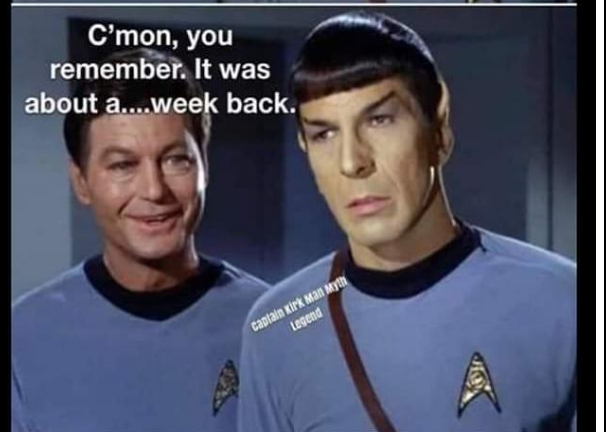

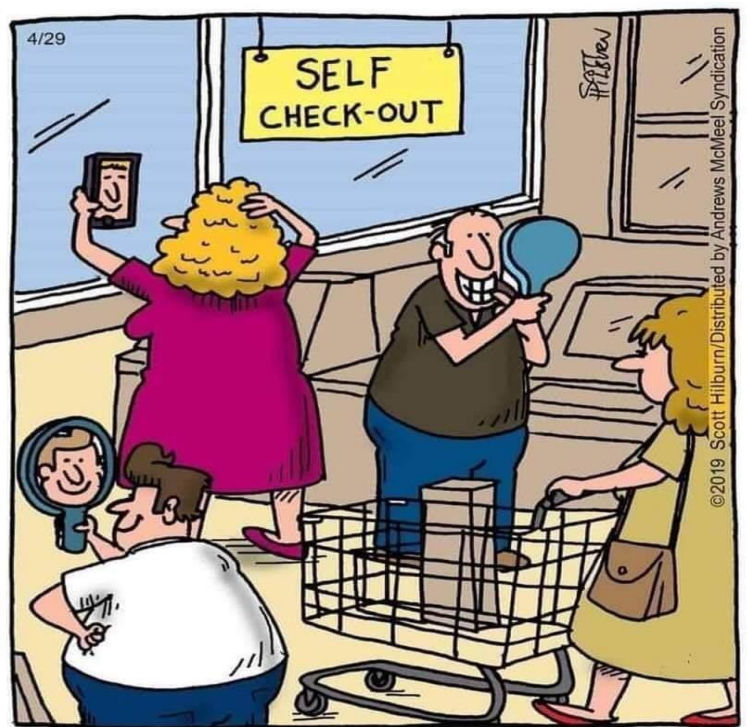
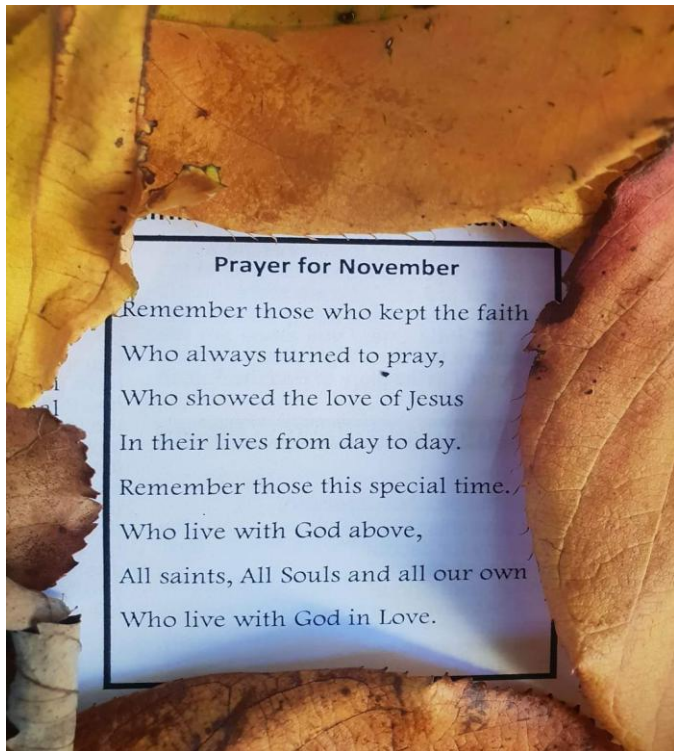
