GLENCORRIB CHURCH BELL - 60th ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATION

You are invited to a special 60th anniversary commemoration of the Glencorrib Church Bell in Glencorrib Church on **Sunday 8th October @ 2pm**. The commemorative event will bring us together to celebrate our faith, our Church, our Bell, our history, and the spirit of generosity within our community. 60 years ago in 1963 John Harte of Mounthenry donated £500 towards the cost of the bell and tower in memory of his brother James Harte who passed away in 1960. It was a lot of money back then when a 3 bedroom house cost £1,000. John's generosity was a significant event in the spreading of the faith through the call of the bell within our parish community.

- Special Commemorative Mass at 2pm
- Unveiling of a special plaque to John & James Harte family follows Mass.
- Refreshments in the community centre follows where there will be an opportunity to share stories about the Harte family, the bell and tower and to express our appreciation.

A special commemorative booklet is being prepared allowing us through photographs and research to travel back in time to 1963 as we celebrate the 60th anniversary of our church bell.

We wish to thank all those who helped us with the history of the Harte family and photographs of the bell blessing by Bishop Michael Browne in 1963. We look forward to seeing you on Sunday 8th October.

SHRULE & GLENCORRIB CHURCH UPDATES

They told me this was a quiet parish! Well, not sure that is anywhere close to the reality if you look at what is happening on the ground! A new and long-awaited extension going in at Glencorrib NS. Well done to all involved and it is great to see the results of hard work coming to fruition; the work done around Glencorrib community field, and the works planned in Shrule around Shrule NS with restoration of the ball alleys and tennis court along with carpark and pitch to the GAA club with the 'Oscarz' creating a buzz with all the different activities going on – this is far from a quiet parish and is in fact a dynamic one. A special word of thanks to Shrule & District Vintage Club on their successful show. Many are commenting and talking about how well it was organized, from parking to the free kids entertainment, and how it was a wonderful way to mark the closing of the summer. And in the midst of all this activity, renovation works are on-going in both churches.

Glencorrib Church

Currently the works being carried out in Glencorrib church include works on the windows; so that they now function again, as well as getting the church painted inside and outside and yes, finally, the doors of the church will be done also. I want to thank everyone involved, and well thank everyone for their patience and understanding. The works done in Glencorrib were done on a phased basis, starting with renovation of the curate's house. The works now currently been undertaken will mark the conclusion of the works planned for Glencorrib. The renovation of the bell tower is also included; to coincide with the 60th anniversary of the blessing of the bell by Bishop Browne. The bell was donated by the Harte family, and this occasion of the 60th anniversary will be used to acknowledge and commemorate the Harte's family generosity.

Shrulle Church

Renovation works are continuing also in Shrulle church. With the completion of the drainage system around the church, along with the new roof, plaster works and exterior painting and works carried out on several stain glass windows, were done to prevent the building to prevent any further dampness, and damage being done to the building through dampness. Now that those works are done, the next step is restoration. The first step will be to remove the damp dry lying along the side chapels, sanctuary and sacristy. This will include removal of plaster and exposing the stonework. As you can see, this phase has now commenced.

It will be necessary to leave this stonework exposed for a number of years to allow it to dry. Then, various options are available – 1. Leaving stonework exposed 2. Applying a breathable render to the walls or 3. Dry lying the walls again. Regardless of any of the options, it will be necessary to leave the stonework exposed for a number of years in order for it to dry.

Unfortunately, extensive damage has been done to the building owing primarily to dampness. This has extensively undermined the integrity of the building, and while the initial phase was about stopping any further dampness taking place, work now will focus on repairing damage done and preventing it from reoccurring so far as is possible, along with carrying out other works which will enhance the building. Plans are currently underway to replace the church lighting. This has become a matter of urgency since the it is no longer possible to get bulbs for some of the lights currently used. The new lighting will feature lighting downward the main body of the church, but also light the timber ceiling with spots on the Stations of the Cross, and on the east side church windows, including the Rose window. The aim here is not just to showcase beautiful features of the church but also to enhance the spiritual and prayerful experience for people. Also, while these works are being carried out, it will be an opportunity to exam the church ceiling for wet/dry rot (consequences of dampness) and woodworm, and possible, carry out some works on the church timber ceiling.

Your Church – Your Parish – Your Support

All the works carried out are done with your financial support. In line with diocesan emerging policy, and with parish policy, each church is self-supporting. Monies collected for the upkeep of Shrulle are spent on Shrulle church, and similarly with Glencorrib. With the rapidly changing situation the Church in Ireland finds itself, the responsibility of upkeep etc of a parish church now rests with the parish community itself. The hope, aim and objective of these works is to secure these churches, your churches for future generations, your children, your grandchildren, your great grandchildren so they will have a worthy place of gathering and worship, open and available to all. In endeavouring to do this, I want to thank you for your continued support in these difficult and challenging financial times. (Now I'm off to find the person who told me this was a quiet parish!!)
